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Overview

Integration of gender issues into DRR policies and programmes is guided through the Comprehensive Disaster Management (CDM) Strategy and Programming Framework

- These 5 year frameworks have been in place since 2009
- 2009-2013 iteration did not fully mainstream gender considerations
- Shortcomings were addressed in the 2014-2018 and 2019-2024 iterations

The CDM Strategic Framework is linked to the Virgin Islands National Policy for Gender Equity and Equality





Gender mainstreaming in DRM in BVI: A snapshot

Engaging women in disaster and climate risk management prevention, planning, decision-making and implementation efforts through the female chairmanship of 4 of the 7 National Disaster Management Committees

Collecting and analyzing gender-differentiated data for assessing acceptable levels of risk on women and girls

Actively engaging women and men from the communities in **local risk identification activities** and the development of Community Disaster Profiles and Hazard Maps

Ensuring women and men have equal access to **early** warning systems by using a diversity of warning mechanism to provide notifications including those that are accessed more by women i.e social media and cell phones











Gender mainstreaming in DRM in BVI: A snapshot

- In collaboration with NGOs, involving women in mangrove restoration and management while helping them to recognise that the mangrove serve as natural buffers for coastal inundation
 - Conducting disaster risk reduction public awareness session targeted to women and vulnerable groups
- Increasing awareness of the public and media on the gender sensitive vulnerabilities and capacities in disasters and gender specific needs and concerns in disaster risk reduction and management
- Prioritising female headed single-families for disaster relief payouts after impact of a hazard
- Collecting and maintaining gender-disaggregated data to inform assessments, strategies, policies, programs and monitoring and evaluation










Gender Integration into the BVI Resilience Model
