Crime against visitors to the BVI is relatively low however by following these few crime prevention tips you can further reduce your chances of becoming a victim of crime.



For Overnight Guests

Hotel, Villas, Boats or Yacht Security

- After checking in, ensure that all cash, cameras, jewelry, laptop computers and other valuables are securely locked away in a safe when not in use.
- All doors and windows should be locked when retiring to bed or leaving the hotel room or boat.
- Do not leave valuables in sight or where easy access can be gained.
- Report anything you regard as suspicious to hotel management or yachting agent.

Visiting the beaches

Avoid leaving valuables visible and unattended either in a vehicle or on the beach.

Traveling through the Territory

- Walk in well-lit areas at night. If this is not possible, hire a taxi or utilize guest services to ensure safety to and from your destination.
- Do not give rides or accept rides from persons unknown to you.
- Avoid traveling with large amounts of cash or leaving electronic equipment in your vehicle
- Avoid using the ATM machines after dark.
- Do not give rides or accept rides from persons unknown to you.
- When driving, keep left, buckle up and use only a hands-free cellular telephone device — it's the law!

For Day Visitors

- Do not leave valuables unattended in stores, restaurants, vehicles or on the beach.
- Avoid traveling with large amounts of cash or leaving electronic equipment in your vehicle.
- Report any suspicious behaviour immediately by calling 311.
